PFIZER STATEMENT ON THE PROPOSED PHYSICIAN SUNSHINE ACT

NEW YORK, NY, January 22 -- Pfizer Inc today issued the following statement on the proposed Physician Sunshine Act:

Pfizer supports efforts by Senators Kohl and Grassley to provide greater clarity and understanding of the paid collaborations between healthcare professionals and the pharmaceutical industry. Pfizer believes these essential collaborations lead to valuable scientific innovations and improved patient care.

We agree with the senators that sharing this information publicly in a simple and uniform manner is the best way to provide a complete picture that will further greater understanding of these valuable relationships.

Pfizer is committed to increasing transparency and disclosure of activities that relate to the public interest:

- In 2002, Pfizer began to register its clinical trials on the public database www.clinicaltrials.gov. To date, the company has registered more than 1,000 trials, including non-interventional studies with prospective data collection.
- Also in 2002, Pfizer began publicly reporting [U.S. political contributions](#).

- In 2004, Pfizer began publicly posting the results of its clinical trials at www.clinicalstudyresults.org. Summary results of more than 800 studies are posted to this Web site. In addition, the company posts study results on www.clinicaltrials.gov in accordance with applicable legislation.
- In December 2006, the company launched a regularly updated public Web site, describing all compounds in its [drug development pipeline](#) and detailing their progress.
- In April 2007, Pfizer began posting on www.pfizer.com its [FDA post-marketing commitments](#) relating to the safe and effective use of Pfizer medicines.
- In June 2007, Pfizer announced its intention to [disclose its grants and charitable contributions](#) for groups that work to promote public health.
- Pfizer began [reporting its grants and charitable contributions](#) on www.pfizer.com in May 2008.
- In September 2008, Pfizer launched its [unbranded Medicine Safety Web site](#).
