



Overview:

The Global Health Fellows Program (GHF) is an international corporate volunteer program that places Pfizer colleagues and teams in short term assignments with leading international development organizations in key emerging markets. During assignments Fellows transfer their professional medical and business expertise in ways that promote access, quality and efficiency of health services for people in greatest need.

Since 2003, over 300 Pfizer colleagues, from offices around the world, have participated in the program working in close to 45 countries. Assignments are focused on optimizing supply chains and business functions, and scaling up promising health prevention approaches. Via the program, Pfizer has partnered with over 40 international development organizations.

Results:

Independent evaluations of the Global Health Fellows program show strong measures of impact for partner organizations, the Fellows and Pfizer. For example, a 2009 study by Boston University’s Center for International Health and Development revealed that 100 percent of partners reported Global Health Fellows helped them to accelerate sustainable change in their health service delivery efforts while 84% of Pfizer managers reported that Fellows’ understanding of the global marketplace drastically increased upon completion of service in the program.

For Pfizer, additional benefits include expanding reach and relationships in emerging markets which helps build the company's value by opening long-term opportunities and giving it a foundation for expanding operations.
