Investigator-Initiated Research (IIR)

Mission: To support independent research projects that advance medical and scientific knowledge about our therapies.

This program is open to researchers across the globe who are interested in conducting their own research.

Types of research that may be supported can include, but are not limited to:

- **Clinical studies** involving Pfizer investigational medicines, including marketed products that are not currently approved for the disease/condition, dose, or method of administration under study
- **Observational studies** (e.g. epidemiology studies and certain outcomes research studies in which the primary focus is the scientific understanding of disease)
- Other types of **independent research on disease states**, including novel diagnostic screening tools and surveys
- **In vitro or animal studies** that include funding

Competitive Research Programs

Mission: To support independent basic science, translational and clinical research through competitive grant programs that advance medical knowledge in the epidemiology, pathogenesis or treatment of selected diseases.

Applications to competitive research grant programs are reviewed by an external panel made up of clinical area experts, and all grant funding decisions are made by the external panel.

Translation

Commitment to accelerating the translation of clinical science to quality patient care

Supporting independent medical education, quality improvement and health services research at academic medical centers and schools of medicine, nursing, pharmacy and public health, as well as national, state and local medical societies to help ensure the translation of science into patient care.





Grants for Independent Learning & Change (L&C)

Mission: To partner with the global healthcare community to improve patient outcomes in areas of mutual interest through support of measurable learning and change strategies.

To ensure that funded initiatives are independent and meet the needs of the healthcare community.

Grants for Quality Improvement (QI) and Health Services Research (HSR) Initiatives:

Pfizer issues evidence-based, data-driven requests for proposals (RFPs) in key clinical areas where gaps have been identified through external entities, registries, and other assessment methodologies and processes. Each RFP will focus on areas where Pfizer support could potentially have the greatest impact on improved patient care and outcomes. Through RFPs, Pfizer aims to fund projects that have the greatest potential to impact patient care. Responses to these RFPs are assessed by an external review panel specific to the clinical area.

Grants for Educational Initiatives:

Pfizer provides grants for the following types of educational initiatives:

Support for Annual Live CME/CE/CPD:

Conferences and congresses which serve as a platform for the exchange of new clinical and scientific information and reach local, national, or regional audiences. Requests are reviewed 4 times per year.

Support for Visiting Professorships:

Eligible organizations can request funding to host a distinguished medical expert to foster educational exchanges with local healthcare providers. Requests are reviewed 4 times per year.

Support for Other Forms of Independent Education:

E-learning activities, symposia, and other educational opportunities for medical professionals. Applications for educational grants are solicited via Calls for Grant Applications (CGAs) 6 times per year.

Requests for Support for Other Educational Activities

Grants for Fellowships and Preceptorships:

Pfizer also supports various other types of educational initiatives that have a more interactive and hands-on approach.

Fellowship grants typically cover 2 years of an individual's fellowship and are awarded to the fellow's employer, not directly to the fellow. Responses to fellowship grant programs are assessed by an external review panel.

Grants to conduct preceptorships are awarded to a host institution who is responsible for identifying appropriate individuals to attend periods of hands-on training at the host institution for periods of up to 2 weeks.

Learning & Change grants are available across many clinical and geographic areas.

Through the support of different types of education for healthcare providers, Pfizer aims to improve the quality of healthcare across the globe.

Partnering

Pfizer regularly partners with third party organizations such as medical societies, patient advocacy groups, payors and government organizations to deliver grant programs in areas of mutual interest and that have the ultimate goal of improving the quality of healthcare.
